

# **Home-School Agreement**

#### As a school we will:

- Respect children as individuals their rights, values and beliefs
- Expect high standards of behaviour through the upholding of school rules, encouraging good relationships and fostering a sense of responsibility
- > Strive to promote each child's health, safety and happiness
- Provide a broad and balanced curriculum and endeavour to meet the needs of individual children
- Encourage each child to do their best at all times and achieve their full potential
- > Encourage children to take care of their surroundings
- ➤ Let parents know about any concerns or problems that affect their child's work, behaviour, attendance and punctuality
- Arrange parents' meetings and open evenings during which their child's progress will be discussed
- Keep parents informed about school matters

## It is the staff's professional responsibility:

- To know the children as individuals; this means where they are in their learning, how they learn, what sort of people they are, and the best way to support them.
- To provide a balanced curriculum; this means helping children to acquire skills in reading, writing, maths, science and all the areas identified as necessary and important by Standlake Primary and the National Curriculum/Early Years Foundation Stage.
- ➤ To help children become independent learners; by encouraging them to think for themselves, develop their own opinions, and to organise their time and resources effectively, with support from the teacher.
- ➤ To help children develop as individuals; by encouraging confidence, self-esteem and positive relationships with other children and adults.
- ➤ To form positive relationships with the parents of the children they teach; so that there is a shared understanding. Children learn best when school and home work together for the benefit of the child.

Please remember: Every child is different and the teacher is trying to do his or her best in all the ways mentioned above for all the children in the class, every day.

#### As a parent/carer I will try:

- ➤ To explain to the child what school is for: a place for learning where he/she will be with other people and that means sharing books, equipment, adult attention and co-operating with others.
- To help the child with his/her learning; this means showing an interest in what your child has done at school, sharing reading books, looking after and returning borrowed books or resources; attending parent's meetings to discuss your child's progress with the class teacher and supporting your child with their home learning.
- To support the school; any worries or concerns should be shared PRIVATELY with the class teacher in the first instance. Please don't voice your concerns in front of your child or other children in a public place. Make an appointment. We are always willing to listen and come to a shared understanding.
- > To send the child to school on time; every day when she/he is fit enough to come, and to collect him/her if they do not go home on their own. Parents/carers will endeavour to avoid taking holidays during term time.
- > To send the child to school ready to learn; Children need to concentrate to learn, and therefore need to be fit and well, to have had enough sleep, to have eaten, and to be suitably dressed.
- > To communicate with the school any special medical needs; or any special circumstances at home that may affect your child's learning.
- To show respect to all staff, parents and pupils; treat others as they would like to be treated
- To follow the school's policies and guidelines that can be found on the school website.

## As a pupil I will try to:

- Attend school regularly and on time
- Accept responsibility for the things I do
- Do all my class work and home learning as well as I can and ask for help if I need it
- Remember to bring the things I need to school
